Understanding the Bible



This Friday night-Saturday (or online) course focuses on the historical timeline of biblical events, the development of the canon, and the challenges of interpretation. The use of commentaries

and study Bibles is discussed as well as responsible use of the scripture in preaching and teaching. The class is prerequisite for those entering the Certificate of Pastoral Ministry program, but other laity are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Instructor: **Rev. Fran Schnarre** is an ordained minister in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and is the Director of Educational Ministries at MSR Center for Rural Ministry. Utilizing Church Conflict



The nature of church conflict will be examined using a variety of diagnostic tools. There will also be a consideration of the dynamics of leadership when dealing with conflict in the small congregation. Options available to pastors for creative intervention in conflict situations will be explored. In addition, participants will have an opportunity to reflect on their personal response to conflict and their most likely strategic action.

Instructor: **Nancy TannerThies**, is a minister in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). She is the Proprietress of *Sapattu*, a small retreat center near Jefferson City, Missouri. She and her husband, Roger, teach classes there and provide space for personal spiritual retreats. Nancy also provides Spiritual Companionship for individuals.

TannerThies' educational background includes a Bachelor of Science from the University of Houston, a Masters in Religious Studies and a Doctor of Ministry from the University of Chicago

Nancy has congregational experience and has also served on the regional staff of the Christian Church of Mid-America. During her time on regional staff she assisted a variety of conflicted congregations. Nancy also was a practicing Intentional Interim Minister for a number of years. She did training for the Interim Ministry Network for more than 15 years. She and her husband were trained as family mediators and had a private mediation practice for more than seven years.

Preaching as a Christian Art

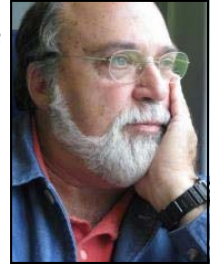

History of the Christian Faith



This historical survey follows the development of the church from its beginning to the contemporary period. The course will focus on the following: Early Christianity, Medieval Christianity, Reformation Christianity, Modern Christianity, and Contemporary Christianity. Particular emphasis will be given to the emergence, development and decline of Christendom.

Instructor: **Rev. Dr. Thomas Minton**, Rev. Dr. Thomas Minton, came to Disciples Christian Church, Nevada, from First Christian Church in Republic, Missouri and began ministry in Nevada in May 2009. He holds degrees from Abilene Christian University and Asbury Theological Seminary in Biblical Studies, in World Mission and Evangelism, and in Missiology respectively.



Thomas has many years of experience in ministry including sixteen years in Switzerland and Germany as well as short-term missions in Holland, Austria, Kenya, the Philippines, Ecuador, and Mexico. 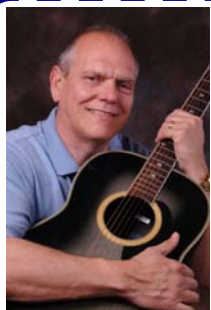

- Developing awareness of theological and practical rationale within their biblical, denominational, and congregational worship tradition, as well as introducing a variety of liturgies and worship experiences that might be used within their current congregation.

He is currently the minister of First Christian Church, Fulton. 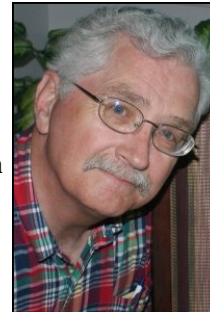
The Practice of Ministry



By the end of this course, the student should be equipped with basic knowledge in practical ministry as it falls within five areas: teaching, worship, fellowship, service and administration. The intent is for students to grow in an awareness of who they are as ministers of the Gospel in a church pastoral setting. How might they also find ways to continue to grow in their competency in their roles as pastors?

In our classes, we will focus on the identity of the minister as pastor, preacher, priest, prophet, teacher, and administrative leader. What are practical matters of how to carry out one's ministerial role in baptisms, weddings, infant dedications, and funerals? How does one channel time management and self-care to avoid burnout and loss of relevance? Moreover, how might the minister lead a congregation through the changes in our world that challenge the future of his/her congregation? What is the pastor's role in building up the community of faith?

Pastor as Spiritual Leader



This class will explore the role of the pastor as the spiritual leader of the congregation. An essential component will be consideration of how leaders nurture their own spiritual lives. The course will include an introduction to the historic spiritual disciplines, meditation and journaling and a consideration of the place of spiritual direction in pastoral care.

Instructor: **Nancy TannerThies**, is ordained in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). She has both congregational and judicatory experience. Currently, Nancy and her husband, Roger, are proprietors and teachers at Sapattu: A Sabbath Place. Sapattu is a small retreat center located on their five acre farm. She and her husband lead classes in spiritual well-being and provide private retreat space. Nancy also offers spiritual companionship to interested individuals.

TannerThies' educational background includes a Bachelor of Science from the University of Houston, a Masters in Religious Studies and a Doctor of Ministry from the University of Chicago. Perhaps more important than her academic credentials or her work experience is Nancy's long time commitment to her own spiritual journey. She considers "dwelling in the presence of the Divine" to be the major focus of her life. In addition to teaching at Sapattu and at MSR, Nancy has been the resource person in the area of spiritual life for church boards and retreats in various denominations and various Disciples' events as well as the Alban Institute.

History and Polity of the Disciples of Christ

The purpose of this course is to explore and analyze the history, polity and characteristic beliefs of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Specific aims of the course include the following:



- Becoming familiar and knowledgeable about the origins, development, growth and current status of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
- Understanding and articulating the characteristic beliefs and practices which make the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) a unique part of the universal church while celebrating the Disciples' ecumenical pilgrimage.
- Identifying and being aware of how the polity of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) works.

Instructor: **Ken Watson** is the recently retired Associate Minister of First Christian Church in Columbia, Missouri. Responsibilities in that position were to give staff oversight for Adult Christian Education, membership development, local outreach, worship, property concerns, and the unique Computer Lab which the church began developing in 1994. A native Missourian, Ken was raised in Warrensburg where he also completed his undergraduate education in Psychology in 1967. Following graduation, he attended Lexington Theological Seminary in Kentucky, graduating in 1972 with a Doctor of Ministry degree. After serving pastorates in Iowa, he came to Columbia in 1978 to pursue a Ph.D. in Educational Psychology at the University of Missouri and was granted that degree in 1985. From 1981 to 1984 he served as Associate Minister for Broadway Christian Church in Columbia. From 1984 to 1994 he served as Associate Regional Minister for the Christian Church of Mid-America, with primary responsibilities in leader development, Christian education and overseas ministry relationships.



Introduction to Christian Thought

An overview of the history and development of Christian theology including an introduction to the basic systems or schools of theological thought. The contributions of the major personalities in the history of theological development will be surveyed.



Instructor: **Bob Flanagan**, an ordained minister in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), teaches in the area of religion and culture in the Religious Studies Department at the University of Missouri - Columbia, and is pastor of the Sturgeon Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Sturgeon, Missouri. Both of these professional roles relate closely to Dr. Flanagan's vocation as a pastoral theologian or, in other words, as someone who thinks constructively about the Christian faith tradition primarily from the perspective of pastoral work. Bob and his wife, Mary, were raised in Kirksville, Missouri, and have lived on ten wonderfully productive acres south of Columbia for over thirty years.

Basics of Pastoral Care and Counseling

This course will examine the principles of pastoral care and counseling and methods pastors can use to help persons understand their life situation and deal more realistically with their special needs and problems. Some time will be given to approaches for counseling with persons experiencing the crisis of grief, marriage and family problems, job related stress, emotional instability, etc. Some modeling of the role of the counselor will take place.

With a look at our own experiences of growth and deepening, we will also consider scriptural encouragements, learning styles, rites of passage, small groups formulation techniques and spiritual gifts identification processes.

With a sensitivity to process and healthy organizations, Rev. Ryan coaches/mentors individuals, groups, and churches toward their desired goals and ministry aspirations. She is a graduate of Brite Divinity School at Texas Christian University and a summa cum laude graduate of Texas Tech University where she studied psychology, child development, and art. She currently is on the Bethany Fellowships Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) leadership team and president of the Bethany Fellowships Board, facilitating and mentoring young ministers in their first five years of ministry. Rev.

Ryan is also a trained and certified labyrinth facilitator through Veriditas with Lauren Artress and a trained Spiritual Director through The Mercy Center in Burlingame, CA.

Kim grew up in Amarillo, TX attending First Christian Church and serving in youth leadership through the Southwest Region of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). She and Bill Ryan were co-ministers in Wabash, IN for five years where son Gage was born 1987. In 1989 Kim was called to serve as Associate Minister at Broadway Christian Church where she ministered until May 2009. Keller was born in 1992. This past year she has worked with Olivet Christian Church and Columbia United Church of Christ. She is the coordinator for a Missouri Foundation for Health grant funded project called TREE - Teen Relationship Education and Empowerment working with 16 Boone County Congregations to resource them in helping their teens discern healthy relationships, unhealthy relationships and abusive relationships. Kim directs the NEOLA camp for 8th graders, That Camp About God and Sex. She is also co-owner and vice president of The Communications Center, www.building.dialogue.com

Missouri School of Religion received two gifts in 2010 that fund our scholarship program. This scholarship program has the potential to effectively cut tuition costs in half for our students.

The Pastoral Scholarship Program

MSR will match, up to \$100 per CPM course, funds provided by the student's church.

Five core CPM courses are offered per year. Tuition for one class is \$390 for 30 hours of classroom instruction or for equivalent online instruction. If MSR receives \$100 from the student's local church, the scholarship fund will match it with another \$100. The net cost to the student would be \$190 per course. This would be applicable to all five core courses per year, saving the student \$1,000 in tuition costs. A proportionate scholarship is available for the annual short course (Evangelism, Christian Education, or Stewardship). **This is an excellent time to begin education for ministry through the MSR Certificate of Pastoral Ministry program.** Other scholarship available for those with out congregational support.

Evangelism in Your Local Context

Nov 30-Dec 1, 2012

Evangelism in the North American context has "lost its luster" in many respects. Because faith is considered a "private" matter, many in our churches and parishioners have foresworn to simply let it be ... no faith-sharing for them. And yet, this stands in complete contrast to Jesus' great commission to go and make disciples of all nations (people groups). The course is not simply an online study about evangelism. Rather, it is a four week training course that will give you the tools to evaluate and articulate your own theology of evangelism and to exegete both your community's and your congregation's culture in order to design and lead effective evangelism efforts.
